

UEA Undergraduate Scholarships General Terms and Conditions 2018 Entry

These terms and conditions cover the following undergraduate scholarship schemes:

1. **Bright Spark Scholarship Scheme**
2. **Donor-Funded Scholarship Scheme**
3. **EU Scholarship Scheme**
4. **International Scholarship Scheme**
5. **Kenyan Scholarship Scheme (scheme to be confirmed for 2018 entry)**

7. **British Council India GREAT scholarships**
8. **INTO UEA High Achievers Award**

1. Definitions and Interpretation

- 1.1 Eligibility Criteria: means all the conditions which you must meet in order to receive the Scholarship and which are set out in Clauses 9,11,13,15 & 17 for each relevant scholarship.
- 1.2 Event outside our control: is defined in clause 6.
- 1.3 You/Your: means the person who registers for a Scholarship upon application under these terms and conditions;
- 1.4 We/Our/Us: The University of East Anglia, having its administrative offices at Norwich Research Park, Norwich, NR4 7TJ.
- 1.5 Unless the context otherwise requires, the singular includes the plural and the masculine includes the feminine and vice versa. Clause headings are for reference only and shall not be taken into consideration in interpretation.
- 1.6 Research project: refers to a qualification listed in Clause 9.1.4 which wholly or in part includes a significant research project element. It is this research element that will be assessed in terms of research theme and needs a separate final grade.

2. Our Agreement with You

- 2.1 These are the terms in accordance with which you apply for a Scholarship as part of your enrolment on an Eligible Programme and in accordance with which we grant you a Scholarship, if any.
- 2.2 If successful, you will be registered and enrolled with us as a full-time or part-time undergraduate student for a credit-bearing undergraduate programme under our Degree Regulations set out in the University Calendar. You must abide by our Charter, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and Policies in force from time to time.
- 2.3 Please ensure you read these Terms carefully. Any of your obligations under these Terms will become binding on you when you register in person with the University.
- 2.4 We may make changes to these Terms from time to time and the version that is applicable to you will be those that were in force at the date of your first enrolment with us.
- 2.5 Receipt of a Donor-Funded Scholarship is subject to a completed Scholarship Agreement Form being signed and submitted by the given deadline. The Development Office reserves the right to withdraw the offer of a Scholarship if it is not accepted by the given deadline.
- 2.6 Only one academic or Donor-Funded* UEA Scholarship will be awarded to eligible students. If you have been offered more than one academic or Donor-Funded Scholarship, you will be able to request which one you would prefer to receive.
- 2.7 If you wish to decline a scholarship offer from us prior to registering at the University please email admissions@uea.ac.uk. We will then withdraw our scholarship offer and confirm this in writing. Any offer of a place on one of our courses would not be affected.

*It is possible to receive a Donor-Funded Year Abroad Scholarship in addition to a regular Donor-Funded scholarship provided the two scholarships do not provide funding for the same academic year.

3. Removal of a Scholarship

- 3.1 We may remove the Scholarship immediately in the event that:
 - 3.1.1 You withdraw from your programme of study; or
 - 3.1.2 You are expelled, suspended or excluded from the whole or part of the University or your programme of study for academic failure; or
 - 3.1.3 We are of the reasonable opinion that you have made any misrepresentation (whether negligently or intentionally) to us either in respect of applying for the Scholarship or during the course of and in connection with your studies at the University; or
 - 3.1.4 We are of the reasonable opinion that you have acted fraudulently or dishonestly in connection with securing your Scholarship or place at the University.
- 3.2 In addition to requiring repayment in accordance with clause 4 below, in any of the circumstances set out in clause 3.1.2 or 3.1.3 above, we may also take such action against you as is permitted under our Student Disciplinary Procedures or Fitness to Study Policy which are set out and available from the University Calendar at www.uea.ac.uk/calendar
- 3.3 In the event of an intercalation, any payments will be suspended until you return and progress to the next stage of your course.

3.4 If at any stage, you decide to defer entry onto the course until the following year, then you will no longer be eligible for a Scholarship. You may apply again the following year, but an award cannot be guaranteed and you will be subject to the eligibility of whatever scheme operates in that year of entry.

3.5 For Donor-Funded scholarships it will be withdrawn if you fail to:

3.5.1 Attend the required events (both the Scholars' Welcome Reception and Scholarships Reception events) or fail to provide the Development Office with communications for your donor when requested.

3.5.2 Demonstrate satisfactory commitment to, or do not progress satisfactorily with your studies. Donor-Funded scholars are expected to maintain strong attendance records and perform at a 2.1 level or above.

3.5.3 Remain in good financial standing with the University. Scholarship instalments may not be paid if you have overdue tuition or accommodation charges.

3.5.4 Inform the Development Office that you are receiving another scholarship or form of funding, as stated in 12.9.

4. Repayment of the Scholarship

4.1 In the event that your Scholarship is removed in the circumstances set out in clause 3 above, you will be liable to pay us the monetary amount equating to your Scholarship, immediately on demand.

4.2 If we have made an error in calculating your Scholarship and as a result you have received any funds to which you were not entitled, we may request that you repay us the amount overpaid and you will be liable to repay it to us within 30 days of our demand.

4.3 In addition to any other rights we may have at law to take action against you for recovery or repayment of the amount equating to the Scholarship, the amount so outstanding will be treated by us as a sum due to us and, in accordance with our General Regulations on Fees and Charges, may mean that you will not be awarded your degree until you have made payment to us as requested.

5. Marketing and Promotion

5.1 You may be required to make yourself available at reasonable notice for any publicity and marketing campaigns which we may want to run in connection with our scholarship schemes, which may include but not be limited to public appearances, speeches, photographs, blogging and/tweeting or interviews.

5.2 International Scholarship holders should endeavour to attend the annual international scholarship awardees event.

5.4 For Donor-Funded scholarships you must attend two mandatory events during your first year of receiving the scholarship. The Scholars Welcome Reception event will be held in October/November and the Scholarships Reception will be held on the first Friday in March. You may also be required to meet your donor at a separate, mutually convenient time.

5.5 For Donor-Funded Scholarships you must also consent to completing tasks set by the Development Office, including but not limited to: completing a donor thank-you letter, providing annual updates and sending a graduation photo, in a timely manner. You are expected to inform the Development Office of any contact with the donor other than that arranged by the University.

6. Events Outside Our Control

6.1 We will not be liable or responsible for any failure to perform, or delay in performance of, any of our obligations under these Terms that is caused by an event outside our control.

6.2 An event outside our control means any act or event beyond our reasonable control, including without limitation strikes, lock-outs or other industrial action by third parties, civil commotion, riot, invasion, terrorist attack or threat of terrorist attack, war (whether declared or not) or threat or preparation for war, fire, explosion, storm, flood, earthquake, subsidence, epidemic or other natural disaster, or failure of public or private telecommunications networks.

6.3 If an event outside our control takes place that affects our performance of on-going obligations under these Terms:

6.3.1 We will contact you as soon as is reasonably possible to notify you; and

6.3.2 Our obligations under these Terms will be suspended and the time for performance of our obligations will be extended for the duration of the event outside our control.

6.4 If, during the course of your scholarship, unexpected circumstances cause the donor to withdraw funding, the University will endeavour to find alternative funding to honour the agreement. However, if this is not possible, the scholarship funding would regrettably be withdrawn.

7. How We May Use Your Personal Information

7.1 We will use the personal information you provide to us to administer the Scholarship scheme. We will retain all documents we receive in connection with the Scholarship scheme along with your other student records in accordance with our Data Protection Policy: www.uea.ac.uk/is/strategies/infregs/dp

7.2 Where external donors are involved in the scholarship awarding process, you must consent to sharing all details included on your application to the scholarship with the donor. You will be asked to sign a consent form upon application. Failure to do so may result in your application being withdrawn. In signing the scholarship agreement, you consent to the Development Office sharing your UEA email address with the donor.

7.3 Once you are enrolled at UEA, the University will contact you using your University student email account. It is your responsibility to check this account regularly for important information regarding payment of your Scholarship, and any other requests relating to the Scholarships scheme

8. Other Important Terms

8.1 We may transfer our rights and obligations under these Terms to another organisation, and we will always notify you in writing if this happens, but this will not affect your rights or our obligations under these Terms.

8.2 No other person shall have any rights to enforce any of the terms of this Scholarship scheme.

8.3 Each of the paragraphs of these Terms operates separately. If any court or relevant authority decides that any of them are unlawful, the remaining paragraphs will remain in full force and effect.

8.4 If we fail to insist that you perform any of your obligations under these Terms, or if we do not enforce our rights against you, or if we delay in doing so, that will not mean that we have waived our rights against you and will not mean that you do not have to comply with those obligations. If we do waive a default by you, we will only do so in writing, and that will not mean that we will automatically waive any later default by you.

8.5 These terms together with your Scholarship and UCAS application form contain the whole agreement between us in relation to the operation of the Scholarship Scheme.

8.6 These Terms are governed by English law. You and we both agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

8.7 All scholarships are for 2018 entry (UCAS 2018 application cycle). If you later defer your place, your scholarship will be withdrawn.

8.8 If you are already fully-funded for your tuition fees you may not be eligible for any of these scholarships (excluding loans)

Bright Spark Scholarship Scheme

9. Bright Spark Eligibility Criteria

9.1 You are eligible to apply for a Bright Spark Scholarship under these Terms if you meet all of the following criteria:

9.1.1 You are a UK citizen, or a citizen of the Channel Islands or Isle of Man and are liable for 'home' fee status. International and EU citizens or those liable for international or EU fees are not eligible for this scholarship. Other scholarships are available for International and EU citizens, details can be found at www.uea.ac.uk/study/international/fees-and-funding/scholarships

9.1.2 You are enrolling on your first undergraduate degree course at UEA, including courses with a Foundation Year and Dip HE Operating Department Practice, in September 2018 or January 2019.

9.1.3 You are enrolled and attending as a student at the University at the time of payment.

9.1.4 You achieve the grades specified below in one of the following research projects:

- A or A* in the Extended Project Qualification
- A in the Extended Essay in the International Baccalaureate
- 45 credits with distinction at level 3 in the Access Diploma, including 9 credits in the Independent Research Project

- D3 in the Cambridge Pre-U Global Perspectives and Research paper

- Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate Level 3 with distinction in the Individual Investigation.

9.1.5 You can link your research project to one of UEA's research themes (outlined here:

www.uea.ac.uk/study/undergraduate/scholarships/scholarships-for-2017-entry/bright-spark-scholarship).

9.1.6 You achieve the grades specified in one of the following sets of qualifications in addition to the specified research project grades:

- AAB at A level

- A level Critical Thinking will only be considered for a Scholarship if included as part of the conditions of an offer. General Studies is not included.

- A* grades are treated as A grades for scholarship purposes.

- Additional AS qualifications are not considered for the Bright Spark Scholarship

- 33 points from International Baccalaureate

- AAABB from five Scottish Highers (or AAB from 3 Scottish Advanced Highers; grades achieved in Advanced Highers supersede grades achieved in the same subjects in Highers)

- DDD from BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma

- DDD from Cambridge Technical Extended Diploma

- 45 level 3 credits at Distinction from Access course

- Cambridge Pre-U Diploma: D3 D3 M2 (in 3 principal subjects)

Scholarships are awarded based on the qualifications detailed above. Combined awards are accepted for the Bright Spark Scholarship, on the condition that each individual award is the equivalent of AAB at A level.

Therefore, combined awards which meet the UCAS tariff equivalent of AAB at A level, but are not individually equal to an A or B at A level, will not be considered. See below for worked examples, demonstrating this.

EXAMPLE 1: A student has one M2 in a Pre-U, a D* in one BTEC subject and an A from a Scottish Advanced Higher. This applicant **would be eligible** as each individual grade is equivalent to an A or B at A-level.

EXAMPLE 2: A student holds an MMM from a BTEC National Diploma, and 2 A grades at

A level. They **would not be eligible** for a Bright Spark Scholarship, as despite their UCAS tariff exceeding the equivalent of AAB grades, the BTEC at Merit is not individually equivalent to an A or B at A level.

9.1.7 To apply for the scholarship you must hold an offer of a place from UEA and to receive the scholarship you must have selected UEA as your firm choice institution, not your insurance choice.

9.1.8 You meet the deadline for applying to the award. This is outlined at

10. The Bright Spark Process

10.1 If you meet the Eligibility Criteria and would like to be considered for a Scholarship, you must complete the application form which can be found here: www.uea.ac.uk/study/undergraduate/scholarships/scholarships-for-2017-entry/bright-spark-scholarship

10.2 You must provide us with relevant details of your UCAS application as part of the Scholarship application process. If you do not provide us with the required information for application of the Scholarship when prompted, or if you provide us with incomplete or incorrect information, we will not be able to process your Scholarship application further.

10.3 We will aim to process your request for the Scholarship in a timely manner, once you have provided the relevant information regarding your research project and how it links to UEA's research themes and provided you meet our Eligibility Criteria.

10.4 Subject to clause 5.3, provided we are satisfied that you meet our Eligibility Criteria and achieve the specified grades, we will pay your Scholarship to your nominated account annually in years 1, 2 and 3 of your course. Each instalment will be £1000. These will take place in February of each academic year.

10.5 Part-time students who study a minimum of 25% full time equivalent (fte) may be eligible for UEA scholarship support. Any support given will be proportional to tuition fees paid and the maximum payable will not exceed the full-time equivalent.

10.6 If we are of the reasonable view that you do not meet our Eligibility Criteria and you wish to appeal, we will ask you to provide us with such proof as we deem necessary to make a new assessment. You must supply us with the requested evidence as soon as reasonably possible.

10.7 If we are satisfied that you have met all the Eligibility Criteria we will pay the Scholarship to your nominated account as set out in clause 4.4 above. However, if we remain of the view that you still do not meet our Eligibility Criteria, we will advise you of this in writing. It is your responsibility to ensure that any change in bank account details is advised to the University.

10.8 The maximum period that an annual payment will be paid to you is three years (36 months) for full-time students or six years (72 months) for part-time students.

Donor-Funded Scholarship Scheme

11. The Difference Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

11.1 You are eligible to apply for one of 'The Difference' Scholarships under these Terms if you meet all these criteria:

11.1.1 You are a UK citizen, or a citizen of the Channel Islands or Isle of Man and are liable for 'home' fee status. International and EU citizens or those liable for international or EU fees are not eligible for this scholarship. Other scholarships are available for International and EU citizens, details can be found at

www.uea.ac.uk/study/international/fees-and-funding/scholarships

11.1.2 You are enrolling on your first undergraduate degree course at UEA, including courses with a Foundation Year and Dip HE Operating Department Practice, in September 2018, or you are a current UEA Foundation Year student entering your year 1 in September 2018.

11.1.2 You must come from a household with an income of less than £30,000*. To confirm this criteria, the University will liaise directly with Student Finance to check that the household income information you have provided to them confirms that your household's income is less than £30,000. When this check takes place (usually in July), if your household income is found to be more than £30,000 you will no longer be eligible to receive the scholarship and your scholarship offer will be withdrawn. To aid this process, it is therefore helpful if you choose to submit your household income information to Student Finance.

11.1.3 You meet the deadline for applying to the award. This is outlined at

11.1.4 To receive the scholarship you must have selected UEA as your firm choice institution, not your insurance choice.

**Your household income will be based on the information you submit to Student Finance. This will be regarding the financial year ending the April one and a half years before the start of your course in September. For example, for 2018 entry, Student Finance ask for your household income between April 2016 and April 2017. 11.2 Other Donor Funded Scholarships with Additional Eligibility Criteria

11.2.1 The criteria for the Difference Scholarships apply to all Undergraduate Donor-Funded Scholarships, however, individual Donor-Funded Scholarships may also have additional criteria, as listed below. Please note

that not all Donor-Funded Scholarships run annually. Some can be claimed as tuition fees or maintenance grants - this will be specified on the website and in your Scholarship Agreement.

11.2.2 The list of Scholarships below is not exhaustive and new Donor-Funded Scholarships may be added to the website at any time. Where this is the case the Terms and Conditions listed in this document will apply and any additional eligibility requirements or obligations for the new Scholarship will be listed on the website or included in your Scholarship Agreement.

11.2.3 We reserve the right to adjust Scholarship eligibility criteria up until the application deadline, provided the change(s) do not make applications already submitted ineligible or disadvantage them in any way.

11.2.4 **The Business, Economics and Finance Scholarship** is available to applicants with Home or International fee status who have applied for a place on the BSc Hons Business, Finance, and Economics.

11.2.5 **The Dominic Russell Scholarship** is available for applicants who have applied for a place on the BSc (Hons) Mathematics or the MMath Master of Mathematics.

11.2.6 **The Dwayne Stallings Scholarship** is available to applicants to all undergraduate three year courses in any faculty who achieve AAA or equivalent at A-level.

11.2.7 **The Edward and Ivy Rose Hood Memorial Scholarship** is available for applicants ordinarily resident in Norfolk or Suffolk who have applied for a place on any undergraduate degree with a foundation year in the Norwich Medical School or any school within the Faculty of Sciences. Preference will be given to applicants over the age of 21.

11.2.8 **The Lee Bray Scholarship** is available for applicants who are ordinarily resident in the Lowestoft or Waveney area.

11.2.9 **The Maria Bourboulis Scholarship*** is available to applicants who are of Greek nationality and are ordinarily resident in Greece. Preference will be given to applicants in the School of Social Work or in the Faculty of Social Sciences.

11.2.10 **The Mark V Williams Undergraduate Scholarship** is available for applicants who have applied for a place on the BSc Accounting and Finance course.

11.2.11 **The Medical Aspirations Scholarship** is available to applicants who have applied for a place on the MBBS Medicine or MBBS Medicine with a Foundation Year course, who are ordinarily resident in Norfolk or North Suffolk. All students who have attended the Medical Aspirations Residential course and secured their place at UEA will be automatically considered for the Scholarship.

11.2.12 **The Mike Hammond Scholarship** is available for applicants who have applied for a place on any three year undergraduate course in the School of Economics. Applicants cannot have a criminal record, and preference is given to those whose parents/guardians did not complete higher education.

11.2.13 **The Mills and Reeve Scholarship** is available to applicants who have applied for any three year undergraduate course in the School of Law.

11.2.14 **The Monica Malik Scholarship*** is available to applicants on any undergraduate course, eligible for Home fees, who are refugees or asylum seekers recognised by the UK Government or who have been granted Humanitarian Protection by the UK government, or who have applied for asylum on arrival in the UK but before applying for a place at university. Applicants cannot be applying for a course at UEA that is equal to or lower than a qualification that the applicant already possesses. Preferences may be given to applicants applying to study a course in the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences or applicants from households with incomes of less than £30,000.

11.2.15 **The Nick Hynes Scholarship** is available for applicants to any undergraduate course though preference is given to applicants applying to study a course in the Faculty of Social Sciences.

11.2.16 **The North Eastern Scholarship** is available for applicants to any three or four year undergraduate course who are ordinarily resident in one of the following North East England postcode areas: Bradford (BD), Durham (DH), Darlington (DL), Doncaster (DN), Huddersfield (HD), Harrogate (HG), Hull (HU), Halifax (HX), Leeds (LS), Newcastle (NE), Sheffield (S), Sunderland (SR), Cleveland/Teesside (TS), Wakefield (WF), York (YO). Preference is given to applicants from the TS postcode.

11.2.17 **The North Walsham Vikings Bursary** is available for applicants to any undergraduate course who have agreed to play rugby for North Walsham Vikings Rugby Football Club.

11.2.18 **The Paul Head Memorial Scholarship** is available for applicants to any undergraduate courses in the Faculty of Social Sciences, who have been educated in the state sector and whose parents/guardians did not complete higher education.

11.2.19 **The Paul Tucker Scholarship** is available for students ordinarily resident in Wales (which is defined as having lived in Wales for at least three years, or having attended a Welsh secondary school). It is for applicants to three year courses in the Faculties of Science, Social Science, and Medicine and Health Sciences.

11.2.20 **The Victor Thomas Penfold Scholarship** is for applicants to any course which includes Politics or International Relations in the title (within the School of Politics, Philosophy and Language and Communication Studies), or any course in the Norwich Business School, for applicants ordinarily resident in England.

**The Maria Bourboulis Scholarship and The Monica Malik Refugee Scholarship do not include the requirement to come from a low-income household.*

12. The Donor-Funded Scholarship Process

12.1 If you meet the Eligibility Criteria and would like to be considered for a Scholarship, you must complete the application form (if applicable) which can be found on our scholarships webpages.

12.2 If you do not provide us with the required information for application of the Scholarship when prompted, or if you provide us with incomplete or incorrect information, we will not be able to process your Scholarship application further. For undergraduate students, the information you submit should be the same as the information provided in your UCAS application.

12.3 We will aim to process all requests for the Scholarship in a timely manner, once you have provided the relevant information regarding the scholarship and provided they meet our Eligibility Criteria.

12.4 Provided we are satisfied that you meet our Eligibility Criteria, and you are chosen by the panel as the preferred recipient, you must then choose UEA as your firm choice (not insurance) via UCAS in order to receive the scholarship.

12.5 If we are of the reasonable view that you do not meet our Eligibility Criteria and you wish to appeal we will ask you to provide us with such proof as we deem necessary to make a new assessment. You must supply us with the requested evidence as soon as reasonably possible.

12.6 Each scholarship's availability is dependent on the generosity of the donor and on available funds. As such, we may withdraw the availability of Scholarships at any time up until a formal scholarship offer is made to a recipient.

12.7 We reserve the right to adjust scholarship eligibility criteria up until the application deadline, provided the change(s) do not make applications already submitted ineligible or disadvantage them in any way.

12.8 If no candidate is judged to be of sufficient merit, Scholarships will not be awarded.

12.9 It is your responsibility to inform the Development Office of any other scholarship or tuition fee reduction which you are offered by UEA, as it is not possible to hold some UEA scholarships with a Donor-Funded Scholarship. Where both a Donor-Fund Scholarship has been offered by the Development Office and a UEA Scholarship has been offered by the Admissions Office or the relevant School, the combined amount of funding available will not exceed £10,000.

12.10 No person will be awarded the same Donor-Funded Scholarship more than once.

12.11 The scholarship is payable after you have completed the University's registration process.

12.12 The values of undergraduate Donor-Funded Scholarships are advertised on our website and the final amount awarded confirmed in writing at point of scholarship offer.

12.13 The majority of scholarships can either be deducted directly from your tuition fee charges by the University's Finance Office or received as a maintenance grant payment direct to your bank account to assist with living costs. This will be confirmed in your scholarship agreement.

12.13 Maintenance grant scholarships are paid in nine monthly instalments from October – June each academic year or as confirmed in your scholarship agreement.

12.14 It is your responsibility to ensure that any change in bank account details is advised to the University.

12.15 If you plan to change your course, intercalate or withdraw from your course, you are expected to inform both the University and the Development Office as soon as possible as this could affect your eligibility for the scholarship.

12.16 Part-time students should understand that any support given will be proportional to tuition fees charged (where applicable) and will be spread pro-rata throughout the duration of the course.

12.17 For students enrolled on a course including a year in industry or year abroad etc., the scholarship will be given for the three years of study during which the student is based at UEA. No funding will be given for the year away from UEA.

EU Scholarship Scheme Eligibility & Application Process

13. EU Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

13.1 You are eligible to apply for an Undergraduate EU Entry Scholarship under these Terms if you meet all these criteria:

13.1.1 You are an EU citizen (except citizens of the United Kingdom) and are liable for 'EU' fee status. You are not eligible for this scholarship if you are a citizen of the Channel Islands or Isle of Man or an International citizen or have a 'home' or overseas' fee status. Other scholarships are available for International and UK citizens, details can be found at www.uea.ac.uk/study/international/fees-and-funding/scholarships

13.1.2 You are enrolling on your first undergraduate degree course, including courses with a Foundation Year and Dip HE Operating Department Practice, in September 2018 or January 2019.

13.1.3 You are enrolled and attending as a student at the University at the time of payment.

13.1.4 To apply for the scholarship you must hold an offer of a place from UEA and to receive the scholarship you must have selected UEA as your firm choice institution, not your insurance choice.

13.2 Eligible Programmes

International Scholarship Scheme Eligibility & Application Process

15.1.3 To receive the scholarship you must have selected UEA as your firm choice institution, not your insurance choice. The scholarship offer-holder must meet all remaining conditions for entry to the University. The scholarship is offered for a specified course; there is no guarantee that the scholarship will be transferred to an alternative course.

15.2 Eligible Programmes

15.2.1 Scholarships may be offered by us in respect of credit-bearing undergraduate taught programmes awarded by us. Applicants for the Norwich Medical School are not be eligible to apply for these scholarships.

- Cambridge A-levels - £1000 fee discount per A grade (maximum of £3000)

- Additional AS qualifications and the Extended Project Qualification are not considered for the Entry Scholarship
- These qualifications must be taken in Mauritius. Awards are for the duration of the course.

22.4 Only one UEA Scholarship will be paid to eligible students. If you have been successful in achieving more than one Scholarship at the University, you will be able to request which one you would prefer to receive.

24.2 The award shall be made as a tuition fee scholarship by means of a fee discount. No cheque or payment shall be made direct to the student.

24.3 If we are of the reasonable view that you do not meet our Eligibility Criteria and you wish to appeal we will ask you to provide us with such proof as we deem necessary to make this assessment. You must supply us with the requested evidence as soon as reasonably possible.

24.4 Only one UEA Scholarship will be paid to eligible students. If you have been successful in achieving more than one Scholarship at the University, you will be able to request which one you would prefer to receive.
