Alongside its diverse range of fitness classes, group exercises, and specialised programs (e.g. Fitness in Later Life and the Inclusive Sports Club for those with disabilities), the Sportspark boasts an Olympic-standard Gymnastics Centre offering sessions for all ages, from babies upwards.

Take part in sports leagues, allowing people of all fitness levels to compete and have fun whilst making friends in a vibrant sports community. Holiday clubs and swimming lessons are perfect for little ones, and family-friendly activity programs are available for all to enjoy.

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# Get free legal advice from UEA's Law and Business Clinics

The UEA Law Clinic offers free legal advice to individuals on 14 different areas of law, including debt, housing problems, homelessness, family law, domestic abuse, employment and discrimination, welfare benefits appeals, and immigration. Find out more using the QR code below.

Once a month, we also run a free Business Clinic, providing advice to local businesses, as well as free workplace mediation services.




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## **WEST CAMPUS TRAIL**

Walk along the side lines of the many sports pitches found at the Colney Lane Playing Fields; from rugby and football pitches to lacrosse and baseball. Use this scenic route to link up with the University's West Campus locations such as Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital and Norwich Research Park.

## Access of trail

Distance: 2.3km

Approx. steps: 3000

Unfortunately this route is not suitable for wheelchair users due to steep terrain.

Walk through mature woodland home to an array of wildlife – just minutes from the University campus. The trail will also guide you along the tree-lined River Yare; be sure to look out for herds of rare breed cattle that have been maintaining the marshland since 2012.

# WOODLAND TRAIL

Enjoy the striking views of the UEA Broad overlooked by the striking architecture of the Ziggurats. Many species of fish live in the Broad, which is one of the reasons you will likely see many different bird species on your walk. If you are lucky, you might spot a grey heron, or even an otter, fishing for dinner

# SCULPTURE PARK TRAIL

Curated by The Sainsbury Centre, sculpture is selected to complement the landscape and the UEA campus. Look out for over 15 incredible works of art by artists including Elisabeth Frink, Antony Gormley and Henry Moore. Many of the campus buildings are worth a second look - designed by leading architects such as Norman Foster and Denys Lasdun, and set within stunning natural ecosystems, including beautiful ancient oaks.

# EARLHAM PARK TRAIL

Earlham Park was originally Medieval farmland, featuring 600-year-old trees, a rockery, and the 16th Century building Earlham Hall and its gardens. The UEA Law School now resides there, but it has previously been home to the well-known Norfolk Gurney family, and famous social activist Elizabeth Fry. Explore the former rose garden or take a break from walking and enjoy the peace of the Dutch Garden in Norfolk's first Silent Space.

#### This short circular route runs right through the heart of campus. Visit the Sainsbury Centre (and Avengers HQ), admire the Ziggurats, which are featured on the cover of an album by The Streets or even try your hand at time travel and wander past the Drama Studio where UEA graduate Matt Smith studied before becoming the 11th Doctor Who.

# How to Get to UEA

#### **BY BUS**

Getting to UEA is a breeze with local bus services:

- First Bus Service 25/26 runs frequently from Norwich Railway Station, passing through the city and stopping directly on campus.
- Konect Bus 512 operates hourly between Hellesdon, UEA, and the NNUH, starting from Norwich Airport Park & Ride.
- Park and Ride Bus Service 511 from Costessey Park and Ride. Free service running Mon-Fri (excluding Bank Holidays), travel time approximately 15 minutes.

#### **BY CAR**

Driving to UEA? Enjoy a £1 flat fee for parking at weekends and bank holidays in the main car park. For parking charges during other times, please use the QR code below.

#### BY BIKE

Cycle your way to UEA using the 'Pink Pedalway Route', an eight-mile path connecting the Norfolk & Norwich University Hospital and UEA to the city centre and beyond. UEA supports cycling with plenty of cycle racks across campus, including some undercover options to keep your bike protected. Additionally, Beryl Bikes are available for rent in 13 bays across the campus. Don't forget our Dr Bike Cycle Workshop, including a free-to-use DIY area with tools and pumps for basic bike maintenance.
