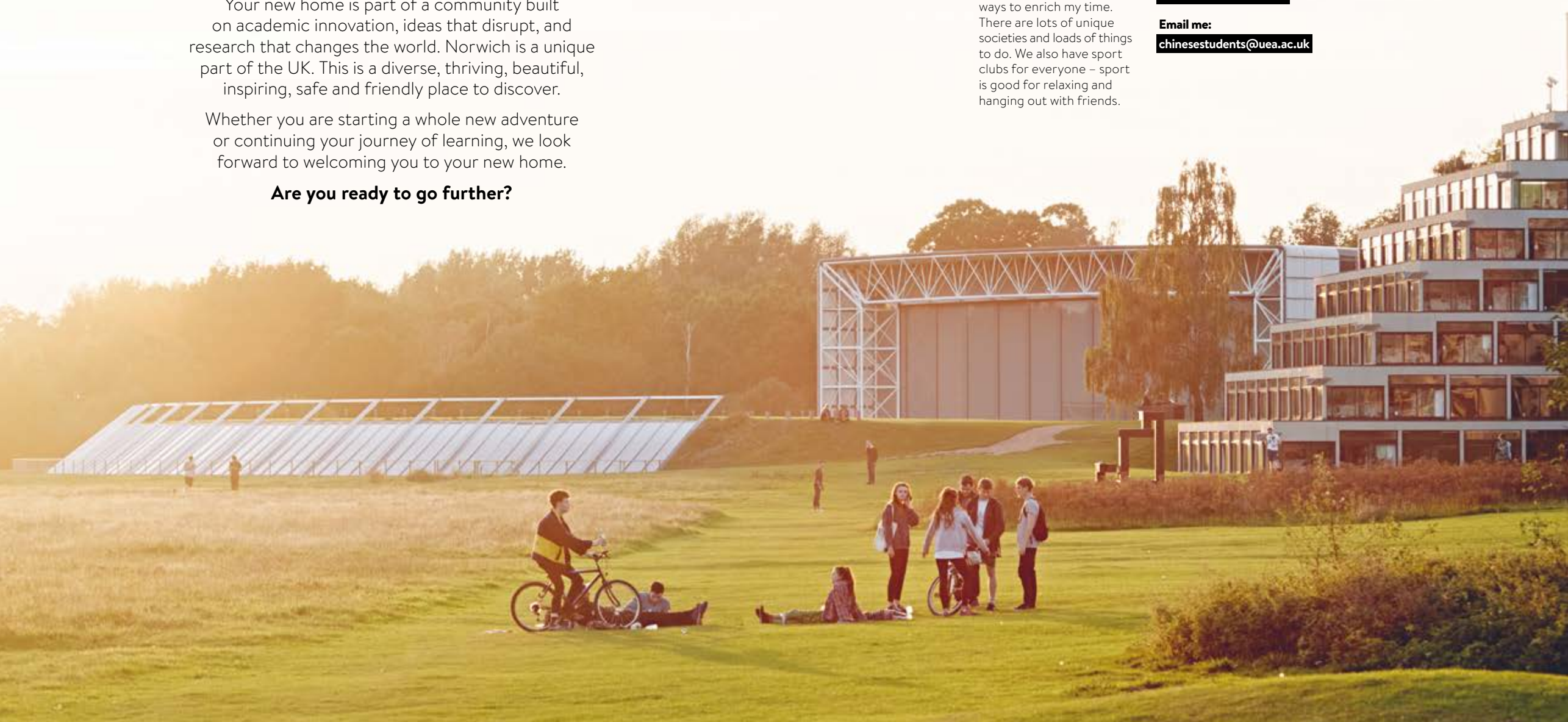

**A CITY OF INTERESTS**

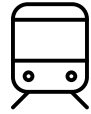

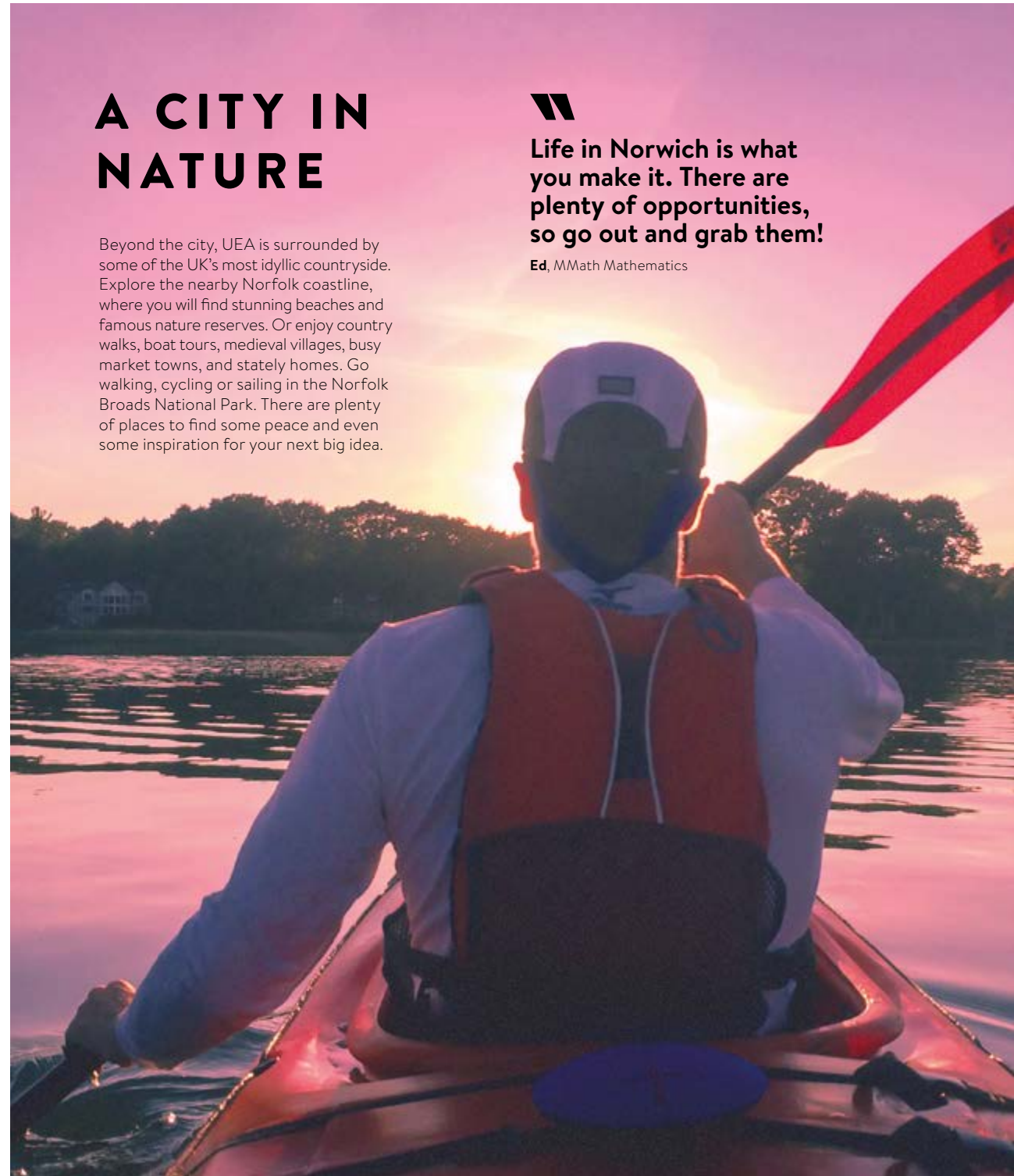
# A CITY IN NATURE

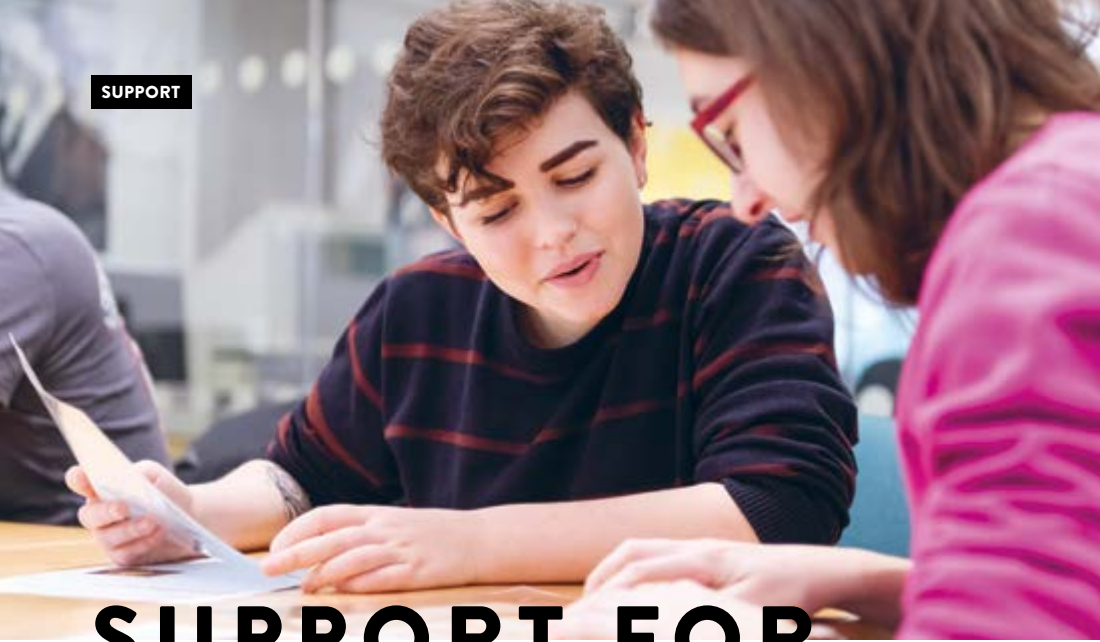

### Student Services

Wellbeing Advisers are embedded within each Faculty, providing proactive support to students directly in their Schools of Study, so there is always someone to turn to.

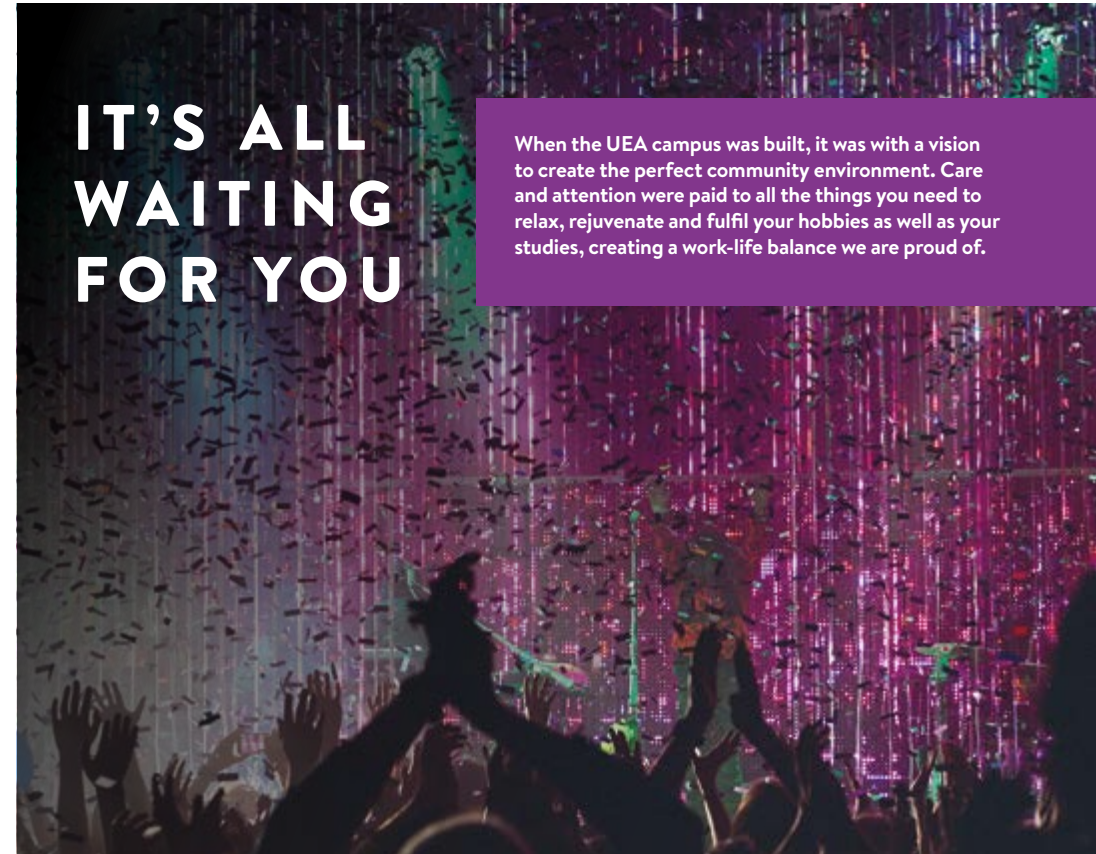
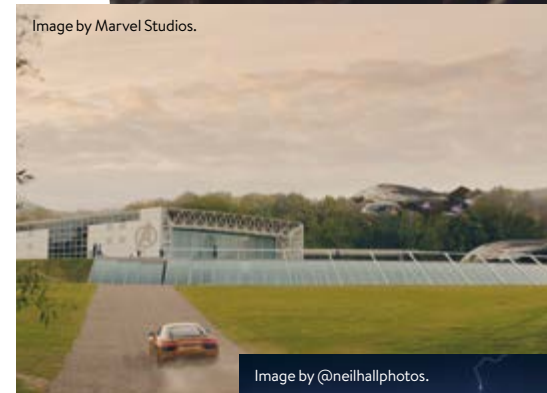

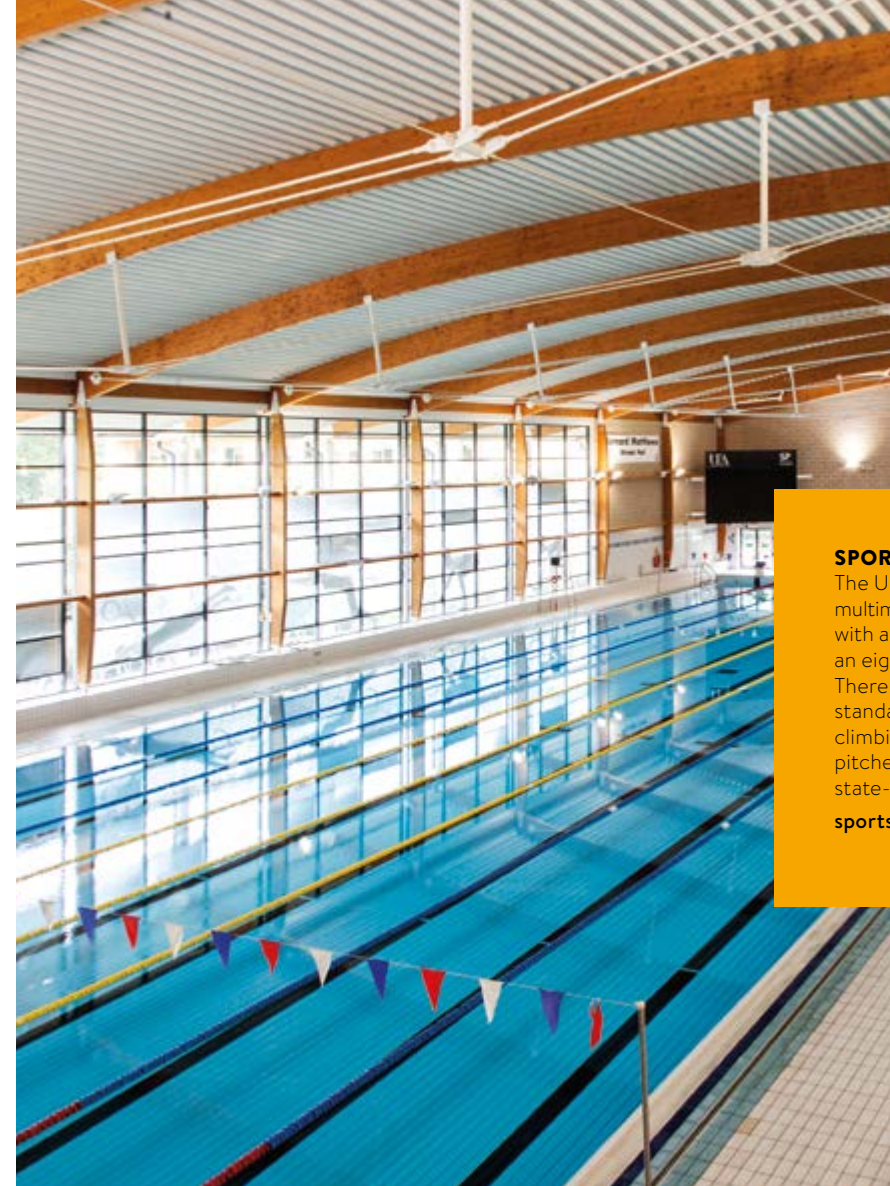






### CAMPUS COMFORTS

# A YEAR OF MUSIC, PARTIES, AND SPORTS EVENTS



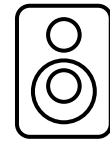
## ENTERTAINMENT ALL YEAR ROUND

UEA has a huge arts and music scene, both on and off campus. The Sainsbury Centre hosts talks, tours, films, exhibitions and special events. And the SU hosts more than 50 gigs a year – previous artists include Stormzy, Lewis Capaldi and Wolf Alice.

The SU's Waterfront, in the heart of Norwich, is a more intimate venue. It has hosted Ed Sheeran, Aitch and Jade Bird, as well as some alternative club nights.

Throughout the year, the ueaSU hosts an iconic programme of events that includes the biggest parties on campus.

The Welcome Ball invites more than 3,000 students to join us for food, games and headline acts. The Derby Day against Essex University sees 40 varsity teams battle it out followed by a huge party in the LCR. Summer brings Go Global, hosted by our cultural societies, showcasing exciting performances and a food festival. And the year ends with our Exit Ball – a festival-style party hosted by acts like Lethal Bizzle or Chase & Status – with fair rides and fireworks to wish our graduates farewell.

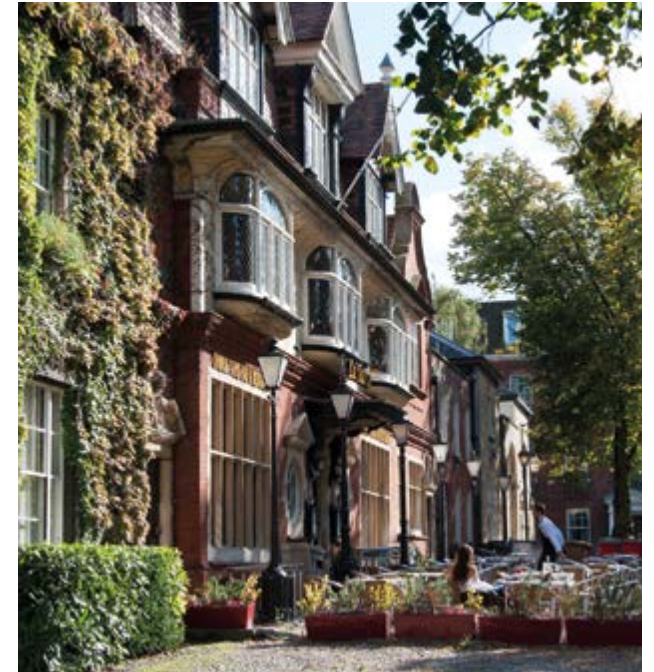

# UNDERGRADUATE STUDY

During your undergraduate study, you will be supported by an Academic Adviser from your School of Study who will offer support, guidance and feedback.

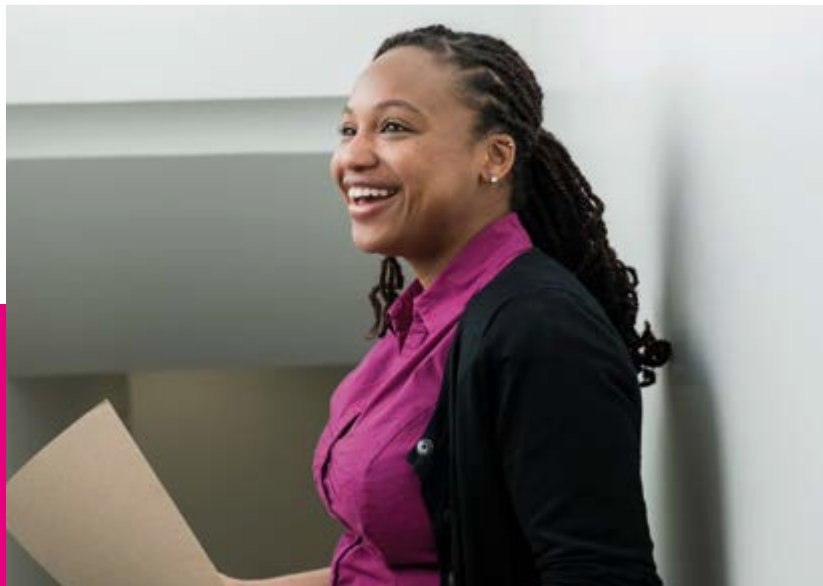
Assessment is through various assignments, coursework and examinations, with most courses culminating with a dissertation or major project in the final year.

A Bachelor's or undergraduate degree can also be referred to as a first degree. Successful completion of any UEA degree will lead to a Bachelor's degree with full honours.

# POSTGRADUATE STUDY

# POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH DEGREES

**Research degrees are usually studied as a PhD qualification and are also referred to as doctoral degrees.**

**Research degrees are usually based on independent study and significant research into a particular field. The final output is a high-quality thesis that will be scrutinised by peers.**

The standard PhD degree length is three years, with candidates usually taking the option of a further six months or more to make revisions.

Students are supported in their research as part of a wider research group and through primary and secondary supervisors who ensure candidates can make their research shine.

We recommend exploring research options online and making contact with potential supervisors or applying to an advertised project.

We look forward to seeing outlines for proposed research areas.

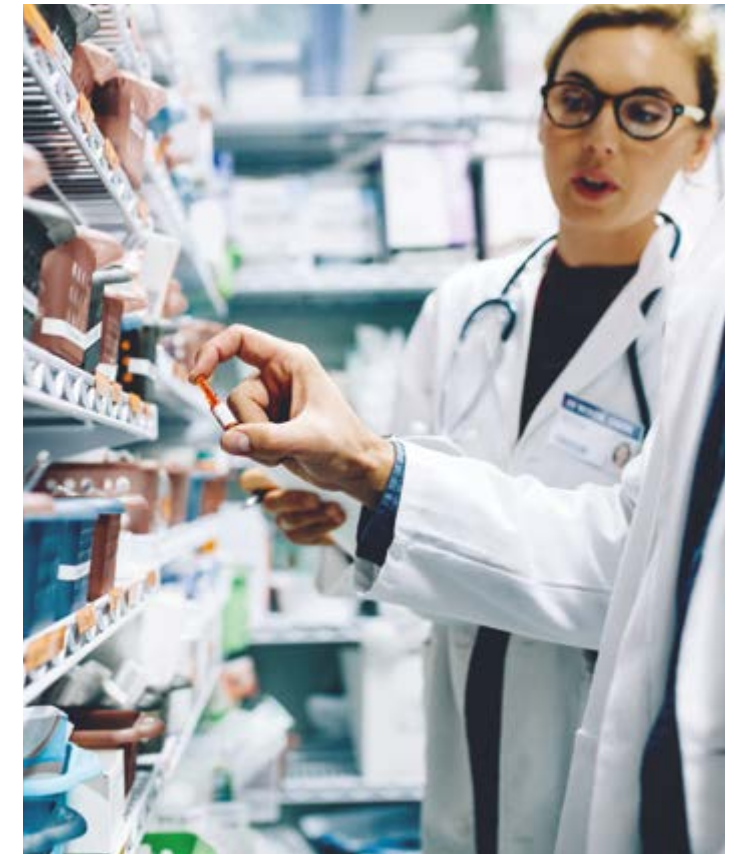

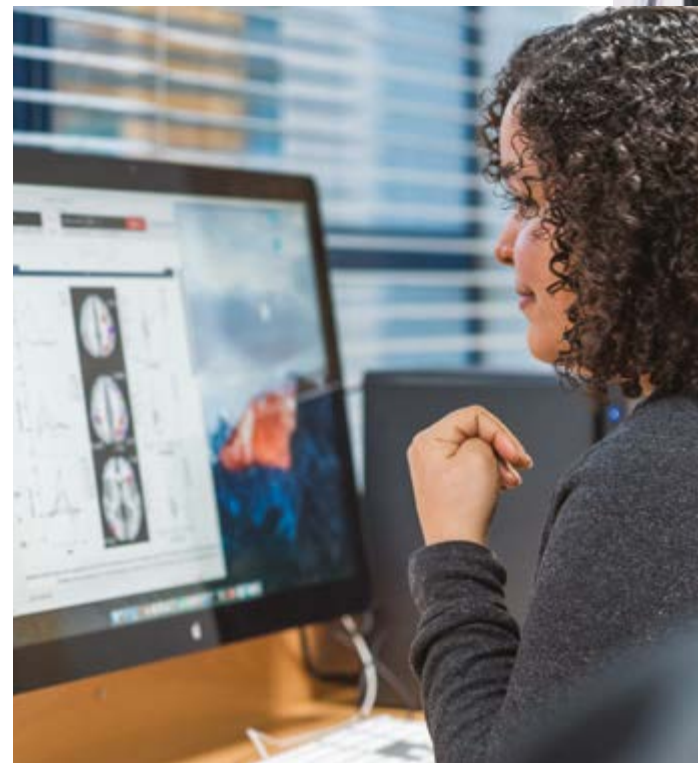

# HOW TO APPLY: UNDERGRADUATES

You need to apply to UEA online through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). UCAS charges a small fee for this service.

As soon as UCAS receives your application, you'll get a UCAS personal ID number. Quote it whenever you contact UCAS or UEA about your application.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS, TYPICAL OFFERS AND PERSONAL STATEMENTS

Qualifications are different around the world. Our admissions staff are trained to understand the marking schemes from a number of global qualifications and will aim to process your application promptly.

We have pages on our website that are dedicated to countries and regions around the world, listing specific requirement guidelines. You can find these on your country or region's page on our website, or you can contact our Admissions team to discuss your exact requirements. All students will need to write a personal statement. ## WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

When you've applied through UCAS, your application will go to our Admissions Service. We treat each application on its own merit, and we take time to carefully consider each one. Occasionally, we invite students to interview. This is a chance for us to get to know each other.

Unless you've already got your exam results, you'll probably get a conditional offer. We base these on your circumstances and the demand for your course. As long as you get the grades in your conditional offer, you're guaranteed a place at UEA.

# POSTGRADUATES

As a global institution, we accept qualifications from across the world. You will need a good undergraduate degree from a recognised higher education institution in a relevant discipline to apply for the majority of our courses. Our dedicated Admissions Officers will review each application individually and make an offer based on comprehensive qualifications guidance.

## TRANSCRIPTS, PERSONAL STATEMENT AND REFERENCES

Your application must be accompanied by scanned copies of certified transcripts and – if available – your final graduation certificate from your earlier university degree. If you are still studying, please provide us with your transcripts to date and an expected completion date.

We ask all postgraduate students for at least one reference (occasionally two) to accompany your application. Your primary reference must come from your previous academic study, either on an official letterhead or via the institution's email address.

You will also need to write a personal statement. This is your chance to tell us about your key skills and experience. It's also where you can show us why you're right for the course, why you want to study at UEA and your post-degree ambitions.

## ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

To ensure that our students are able to fully benefit from the excellent programmes that we run, we ask for evidence of English language proficiency from students where English is not their first language.

Popular proficiency tests include IELTS, Cambridge English exams, TOEFL and Pearson. However, we also accept a number of other country-specific examinations.

Here you will find our minimum entry requirements. However please be aware that some courses require a higher score to be attained.



# INTO UEA PRE-SESSIONAL PROGRAMMES

## INTO UEA PRE-SESSIONAL PROGRAMMES

INTO UEA Pre-Sessional English programmes not only boost English skills, but allow you to gain confidence in a setting very similar to that of your degree, while at the same time settling into campus life and studying alongside new friends. You may wish to take a Pre-Sessional English programme to meet the requirements of your UEA offer or to further improve your English for study.

Pre-Sessional English Programmes run across 4, 6, 8, 12 and 16 weeks and each option is designed so that students can improve their English from their current standard to meet UEA entry requirements.

# VISAS AND OTHER INFO

**The majority of international students studying in the UK will need to apply for a Student visa. This visa is student-specific and allows you to study in the UK and work part time while doing so.**

When making an application for a visa, you will require a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies, otherwise known as a CAS. Your CAS is UEA's endorsement of you as a potential student at the University and you cannot submit a visa application without it. Your CAS can only be used to apply for the course stated on it at UEA.

You will also be required to prove that you have enough money to support yourself and also pay for your course. You can find more information on what you will need and the evidence required on our Visa support page in the Study section on our website.

You may also need additional documentation such as proof of English proficiency or your qualifications.

Applicants from a number of countries must also provide a tuberculosis screening test from a UK Home Office approved clinic when making their application.

You are able to work for up to 20 hours per week during term time and 40 hours per week during holidays under the terms of your visa, and students completing their studies may be eligible for the Graduate Route.

There is a lot of information on visas on the UK Government website. We recommend that you are fully aware of its contents well in advance of planning to submit a visa application. Application processing times can vary depending on your location and the type of service paid for.

If you require help, we have a global network of partner agents who will be able to provide assistance.

## GRADUATE ROUTE

The UK Government has announced the introduction of the Graduate Route (GR), which is open to all students on a visa sponsored by the University and graduating successfully from the summer of 2021.

Under the scheme, graduating students will be able to apply for the right to remain in the UK for a period of time after study. For undergraduate and postgraduate taught students, this will be two years; for postgraduate research students, this will be three years. Successful applicants on this route will be able to stay and work, or look

for work, in the UK at any skill level for a maximum period of two years for Masters' students and three years for PhD students. Graduates will be able to switch onto a skilled work route should they have found a suitable job.

# PAYING FOR YOUR STUDIES



One of the most important areas to consider when making your study choice is the overall cost. At UEA, we review our tuition fees on an annual basis to ensure they are competitive and offer value for money. Additionally, we offer a scholarship scheme that awards offer holders more than £9.3m each year.

## DEPOSIT

In order to secure a place on your chosen programme of study, guarantee your accommodation and obtain your CAS letter (which is needed to apply for your student visa), we require all international Postgraduate Taught Master's and Postgraduate Research applicants to provide a minimum deposit of £2,000. The deadlines for receiving

the International Deposit are 31 July for Postgraduate Taught Master's students and three months prior to the start of the course for Postgraduate Research students.

Undergraduate students are not required to make a deposit payment; instead, you will need to choose us as your firm choice in UCAS to guarantee your place of study and accommodation.
